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I've been seeing this one gal for about 4 or 5 months. At first I am very romantic, gentlemanly, and trusting. I get her hooked on the best she's ever had, her words, and we know, that as players, this must be the case. I remain being a gentleman, but I start teaching her the lessons one at a time.

1. One night I call Denise and she is not home so I leave a message. Then I call later and she is still not home so I leave another message asking where she is. I make it stern and poignant. The next day she leaves a message for me explaining her absence. It is legitimate and I believe her. I could have been supplicating and said: Oh I understand. But I don't. Instead I turn it into a disaster. The next time I see her I am quiet and distant. She begs to know what it is. Finally I tell her: We are in a physically intimate relationship, and if you want to be with other men, you have to tell me now and we can just end this, because I will not share you and I will not risk catching anything. She is shocked to hear this and goes into a long dissertation explaining her absence and says: You are the only man I am with. I want only you. You have to believe me. I say to that: Am I your only man? Yes baby. Am I all you need? Oh yes baby. Do I satisfy you totally? Oh yes baby. And then she shows me that I do. I reward her with more of the best, and by believing her that she is faithful to me. Lesson learned: Do not make me jealous.

2. Two days before a date we had for a Friday night, she emails me and cancels, for a very good legitimate reason. I could have been supplicating and responded with: Oh that's OK honey. But instead, I do not respond to the email. On Saturday, she emails me to ask how I was and talks about how her problem was solved Friday night. I do not respond. Then on Wednesday she emails me again asking where I am. I reply with I want to be with someone who thinks I am important enough to them that they would never cancel a date on me. She writes back with a very long apologetic letter saying, I am so very very sorry David. You have to understand how important you are to me. I don't want to lose you. What can I do to make it up to you? Please talk to me. I need to see you. I write back with I might come over tonight for a little while and we can talk about it. She is delighted when I arrive but I am coy. She holds me lovingly and consoles me and apologizes. We talk about what I had said, just to drive the point home. Then she makes up for it in the manner that I fully expected that she would and we enjoy another great night at her place. I reward her by making a date with her for three days from now. Lesson learned: Never cancel a date on me.

3. About 2 weeks later, I have Denise drive to my place and from there I take her out to dinner and then dancing. While at the night club, I run into a gal I had dated last year who is now a good friend of mine. She is with her boyfriend. I introduce her to Denise. I talk with her and her boyfriend for a while. Then she wants to

introduce me to one of her girl friends. I go with her and talk to her girlfriend for about one minute. Then I return to Denise. She is pissed. She is quiet. I ask Are you jealous? You have nothing to be jealous of. I then get quiet. Then I tell her I want to leave. I take her out as I walk three paces in front of her and take her back to my place. She is still pissed but she wants to have sex. I wait until she is half undressed and all excited, and then I say You better go. She is now really pissed and storms out. I do not call or write. She emails me later and talks like nothing happened. I do not respond. Then she writes again and begs to talk to me. I write back and say: You act as if you do not trust me. I want to be with someone who I can enjoy complete and honest trust with. She writes back with a long apologetic letter saying that she trusts me totally and wants to know what she can do to make me trust her. I write back and say: We are in a physically intimate relationship. That requires total and complete trust. If we are going to be intimate, I need to know that we are fully trusting of each other.
